Form of future perfect:</b></p> <div style="border: 1px solid black; padding: 2px; text-align: center;"><b>Will + have + past participle</b></div> <p>We use the future perfect to say that an action or event will be complete at a specific time in the future.          I will have finished my project by the weekend. (by = not later than)          This time next year, I <u>will have graduated</u>.</p> <p><b>* We use the future perfect to predict the present.</b>          Don't bother going to see him he'll <b>have left</b>.</p> <p><b>D.
